Update - April 2023

1. Spring Clean

What a wonderful turnout and effort for the Spring Clean. The club and surrounds look marvellous, and everything is ready for the new season.

2. Green Opening

Hopefully you will have seen the email from our Captain to say that, due to the adverse weather and the treatment still being applied to the green, it has been agreed with the council that the green will now be open on the 22nd April, a week later than previously planned.

Once the green is open, you will need combinations for the gate, clubhouse and equipment sheds. Have a word with David Harnden if you have forgotten these numbers.

3. On-line match booking

All those with email should now be receiving invitations to sign up for friendly matches. The match selections are being sent out by email. You can also sign up at the club and the selections will be displayed there as well.

4. New raffle arrangements

In the past we have purchased prizes for the mixed raffle and this is quite a lot of work for those involved. This year we are going to try something different. Everyone will pay £1 for the raffle as previously. There will be no tickets. The draw will be made using a set of disks which include home and away sides, each rink and each player. So, the call might be "Home team, rink 2, lead". There will be three cash prizes, the amount of which will depend on the number of players.

14. Cooperation with Bracknell Town Council

You will no doubt have noticed that the Town Council has been working very hard on our green. They have agreed to leave a border of longer grass around the edge of the green to reduce the tendency for bowls to roll off. This should also increase the durability of the edges to the green.

The Executive are grateful that the Council has agreed to contribute half the cost of cutting the hedges around the green. The Council has also moved the guardrail for the disabled toilet, removed the large hedge alongside the clubhouse and put down a soft surface, providing a much-improved space.
